

Electoral Roll – notice of revision: The opening of revision of the electoral role will start in 14 days' time and closes on Saturday 10th April. However, most importantly, it is a significant way of showing your membership of The Dorcan church. Do consider joining the roll if you are not currently on it.

Local Ecumenical Partnership Listening Process – another update

Back in November we were asked for our input into a listening process for all Single Congregation Local Ecumenical Partnerships (SCLEPs) across the Bristol-Swindon area. Many of you engaged with this and Dorcan's views were heard and understood, both the joys and challenges.

The summary of contributions has now been completed after a little delay which was for good reason. The quality and depth of many of the comments has meant that the senior leaders in the various denominations have sought to take more time to explore and really listen further as to what SCPEPs are saying and how they need support and encouragement. At this stage we have been asked to confirm that the views summarised reflect what we said and then the next step is to look at how we might address some of those common issues that SCLEPs face.

Thank you for your engagement in this last year, and your comments have been heard! We will let you know of developments as they happen.

We need everyone's help please!

Please see separate email sent 31st March 2021 with more detail. Over the last month or so, a group of us has been looking at different ways in which people can help serve the church, and we hope that more people will feel able to offer help in some way.

You will know that at present we don't have any Churchwardens or Senior Church Stewards for St Paul's or for St Tim's, and we really need to find volunteers who will take on these roles. Initially we have looked at reducing the scope and therefore workload of these roles as far as possible, by sharing some of these responsibilities around, and using the flexibility of team-working to make it easier for people to offer their various gifts and time. But there are also plenty of opportunities for people to offer help without having to take on a formal role.

We will be sending out more details shortly in readiness for our Annual Church Meeting, but for now ask you to consider whether you could offer to help in some small way as a church volunteer, or to take on one of the more formal roles above. Remember T.E.A.M. stands for Together Everyone Achieves More, and in God's service, that means a lot.
