





#### What is it?

On 1<sup>st</sup> February "Transforming Church. Together" was launched and is our chance to share what God is saying to us about the future of his church. We share the following from the launch:

*"Transforming Church. Together". is all about the Church of England in our region shaping a new vision and set of priorities for the coming years. We want to understand what we do well, what we can change for the better and then create a positive way forward together. This year-long process is called Transforming Church. Together.*

*We are beginning with conversations – with communities, congregations, clergy, church leaders, and staff. Between February and April 2021 we will start talking and listening with lots of different people, both within and outside the church.*

*We will listen carefully to understand what each other think and feel about God and the Church of England, but also about our communities, society and the world."*

## How can I be involved?

We are all invited to get involved in a number of ways:

- Workshops: Through a facilitated 90minute workshop, capturing insights and thoughts to help shape a future vision and priorities. ECC is participating in one of these at their February meeting, and there is an opportunity as a church to engage with a workshop set up for Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> March at 7 or 7:30pm start TBC.
- Engagement in small groups: You will find an online questionnaire at <https://www.bristol.anglican.org/transformingchurch/jointheconversation/> Why not engage with this in a small group – whether a home group or a bunch of people you feel you want to gather together. Very soon there will be specific resources to support children and young people to engage – we need their views for the future of the church as they grow up.
- Individually: If you'd prefer to ponder away from a group then the questionnaire can also be completed as an individual and submitted. If you do not have access to the internet, paper copies can be provided. Please let Trudie know if you'd like one on 01793 326128.
- Pray: Please pray as we look to the future. This prayer written for this engagement may help you

*God of the Way,  
you call us to leave familiar places and to set out on new paths.

We are also asking those in our community what they think and here at Dorcan we have a wonderful platform through our community centre to engage and ask for thoughts from voices who perhaps are not heard as often.

This is our chance to share what we feel God is saying to us about the future of God's church and how "be" and "do" church for Him. Please do pray for Transforming Church, and that we will be faithful to God and where he may be leading us.

### **Living in Love and Faith**

In November 2020 the Church of England published a book *"Living in Love and Faith"* (LLF) and associated resources, beginning a process of discernment and decision-making on questions of identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage. These resources have been designed to help all God's people come together to learn about and discuss matters of human identity and sexuality, an arena which, in the Church of England, we have found very difficult for a number of years. Our difficulties have often caused hurt and puzzlement both inside and outside the Church and been a stumbling block to our collective witness.

As a diocese we will be engaging with LLF during 2021 and we are encouraged to do the same across our worshipping community and wider into our contexts. With the priority on *"Transforming Church"* in the earlier part of 2021, the focus on LLF will be from May onwards when we are invited to a conference which will provide a launch point into listening and exploring together and will include guidance on how parishes and other settings can make use of available resources and engage widely.

This is not an easy topic to explore and it is important that those with different views, perspectives and experience can express them alongside others who may hold very different positions. Please pray that in these coming months and years, our listening and learning together might, in the Bishop of Coventry's words, "help us to discern together the work of the Holy Spirit in our common life and lead us into the future that God has for us as we seek together to serve Christ fully and faithfully." *Trudie*

### **Review of closure of Church buildings:**

Last month we shared that Standing Committee would review the current position of the closure of our building the week commencing 15<sup>th</sup> February, which coincided with government's own review of lockdown. Since then the government has amended this to Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> February and extended the closure of schools to at least 8<sup>th</sup> March. When we have heard details of the government's review, we will then consider our own position regarding the ongoing closure of our buildings. For your information, all Methodist churches and almost all Anglican buildings remain closed in Swindon. Thank you for understanding why we have made this decision to close and for continuing to be an awesome and active church in the community!
