Today is the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of our discipleship series on Sunday morning called "Giving with Grace". We have already explored what we can learn about financial giving from some of the parables from Matthews gospel, and we continue this focus today and next Sunday.

Talking about money can be tricky and raise all sorts of emotions, so thank you for your grace and engagement with this discipleship series.

One of the things we did at our recent Annual General Meeting was to make a presentation on our church finances and budget and also provided a commentary. We continue to pray as we learn and explore together what it means to "Give in Grace".
