Please read this important notice.

This notice is about a crucial area of this church's life and which is now impacting the mission and outreach of this church. Please can I encourage you to continue to read on when I share that it is about safeguarding and this is a request for you to consider how you might help.

We are looking to build a team to work together and support each other as we fulfil our pastoral and legal duties in this area. We are thankful to Dianne Lane in her continuing role and to offers of some support from outside the parish, but the reality is that we also need more people to support this work who are here "on the ground" and are church family. Covering some of the more complex areas of the role is progressing, however we are in great need of administrative support.

Many of our processes and guidelines are set up but we need to ensure they are followed, maintained and kept up to date, and often involve liaison with other church members and groups. For example, ensuring job descriptions are drawn up by group leaders and signed, applying for DBS checks on line and verifying addresses, requesting references and ensuring receipt, periodic checks that registration forms are up to date and complete, updating training records and needs etc. Please can I ask you to consider two ways in which you might help, both of which are needed at this time:

Taking responsibilities for some of the administration:

This is a pressing need and if you would like to know more of the kind of things that may be involved then please speak with Trudie Wigley (326128)

Giving financially: This would enable us to pay for those particular aspects of the role which can be undertaken from outside our church membership. If this is an area you feel able to commit to, then please speak in confidence to our Treasurer Tony (520734)

We have now reached a point of no longer being able to undertake the process required for new volunteers for our various church activities, which is a particular concern when our children and young people's work is growing and thriving and we need more helpers. **This situation is therefore now impacting the mission and outreach of this church.** Please can you commit this to prayer, and particularly that God will guide us and that the right people will come forward to form a new supportive team? Thank you.

Walk of witness: from the Dorcan Church Ministry Team.

It has been proposed again this year that all members of the Dorcan Church are invited to participate in a 'Walk of Witness' for our faith. Two days have been put forward for consideration and these are 'Palm Sunday' (20th March) or 'Good Friday' (25th March).

In order that a convincing 'witness' be shown in our community it would be appropriate for a large number to participate, that is, at least 20 people. Are you willing and able to 'walk'? Everyone is welcome, adults, children and friends. There are a number of possibilities, including the Palm Sunday 'witness' possibly walking between St Tim's and St Paul's, with a short act of worship at the beginning and end. For Good Friday we may want to consider an act of worship (bible reading & prayers) at 'Morrisons' (with permission) with a walk to St Paul's and a final act of worship. These are all possibilities and to be considered in parallel with other services being planned.

Please let anyone in the ministry team know if you are willing to commit to this and which (if any) day you would prefer. It is not intended to do both. If we are to be effective witnesses for Jesus then we need to start planning. There is nothing wrong in saying 'I can't go' and no explanations are necessary; but we do need to plan, so please, one way or another, let your ministry team know if you can join in.
