# Covid Measures – Plan B – update on practice at Dorcan Church

We all share the ongoing frustrations and concerns over Covid, and the latest news this week regarding the new variant and the implementation of Plan B were not welcome. Standing Committee met this past week and reviewed our procedures and Christmas services and as we were already being prudent in our practice there are only a few changes. Standing committee would like to highlight and share the following:

#### Practicalities when gathering

- The wearing of masks is now a legal requirement unless exempt per government guidelines. Please do therefore wear masks, including when singing;
- Doors to the outside will be open in both centres for ventilation as good air flow is a significant mitigator in the transmission of covid. We do realise that this means that heated warm air will flow out of our building and it may be a little more breezy, therefore you may wish to bring an extra jumper and your favourite blanket for your knees!
- At St Paul's the screens will be opened once more and rows of chairs spaced out into the hall. The printed x and Ö signs will be available for you to place next to you to indicate whether you are happy or not for people to sit next to you;
- At St Tim's, some chairs will be removed to aid distancing, with a maximum of 40 people in the chapel;
- ♦ In both centres signing in and/or QR codes will continue to be used

#### Christmas services

We are continuing with our planned services. We are able to do this as we were already being prudent in moving our carol service outside and offering two, number limited, Christingle services.

### Our employees – Jenny and Maggie

Maggie, our Church administrator, will continue to be in the office for her usual hours. Jenny, our centre manager, will be working elsewhere for some of the week and there will no longer be any overlap where they are both in the office. If you come into the centre to see them, we ask that you wear a mask, knock on the office door and wait to be either invited in, or asked by them to meet in a more open space.

Thank you for your understanding as we look to take more precautions to keep us all safe. This is an unwelcome move, yet one that we take in our calling to be responsible to one another and to love one another. Thank you church family.


