

The Dorcan Church AGM 10th April 2011

Changes in regulations governing charities mean that Churches with turnover of £100,000 and above must be registered as charities with The Charity Commission. This means The Dorcan Church applying for Registered Charity Status.

To this end it is intended to ask the 2011 AGM to adopt the proposed Constitution so that this process can be moved forward. This new Constitution is based on a model constitution for Ecumenical Churches, which has been agreed by both the Anglican and Methodist bodies as well as the Charity Commission.

Members of the 2011 Ecumenical Church Council will be Trustees of the Charity, and registered as such with the Charity Commission. **This has not changed from the current position**, as the trustees at present are the Ecumenical Church Council. The only real change is that trustees have to formally sign a trustee document.

Methodist Insurance do offer indemnity insurance in case of any comeback for mistakes, and it has been recommended that The Dorcan Church take advantage of this, to protect the Ecumenical Church Council.

In recent years there appears to be a reluctance among the Church Membership to take on offices in the Church, for the smooth running of God's Church, and to avoid putting extra work load (and stress) on Clergy and other Officers. It is extremely important that we fill all the vacancies on the Council, so please prayerfully consider whether you are called to serve on the Council, or as a Warden/Steward.

Nomination forms will be available in all Centres.

Please do all you can to ensure we have a fully staffed Church and Council.

If "we" don't run the Church nobody else will.
